Policies and Expectations

Representing your FFA chapter and school in a professional and courteous manner is an expected characteristic of an FFA member and advisor. The ND FFA State Convention is a showcase of ND FFA in a fun and professional environment to guests, volunteers, sponsors, and NDSU.

Members and advisors are accountable to each other to obey the FFA Code of Ethics, FFA State Convention Policies and Expectations, North Dakota FFA Student Permission Form, and NDSU Waiver Form.

FFA wristbands are required for access to all components of convention.

Members and advisors are to be appropriately dressed for all convention events and activities.

No headgear may be worn by members and advisors in the convention hall, or during any CDEs. FFA official dress for members and business casual dress for advisors is expected for all convention sessions.

Communication devices at CDEs are prohibited by members, unless directed by superintendents.

Residence halls and lounges contain posted procedures to follow in case of emergencies and are designated as male or female housing. Everyone is to be in sleeping rooms 15 minutes prior to lights out.

Illness is to be reported immediately to the FFA Office. After hours, Sanford Medical Center at (701) 417-2000. Emergencies call 911.

NDSU and the ND FFA Association is not responsible for damaged, lost, or stolen personal items. Individuals will be held responsible for damage to NDSU facilities.

All modes of transportation will be parked in designated parking lots.



- In the top right corner, click Create a Free Account;
- It may ask to register/verify your phone number for bidding (the website will send a confirmation email, may take 24 hours to verify your account);
- Search for ND FFA Foundation/Alumni Auction;
- Scroll through/select item to bid on;
- Enter the desired bid;
- The Max Bid check box allows the bidding system to bid for you up the bid amount selected. The bidding system will place bids for you, when needed, to keep you in the lead, until you Max Bid amount is exceeded; and
- Click Submit.

When the **Online Auction** closes, each item/lot closes in 2 minutes increments after closing time.

<u>Example</u>: 30 items, with each item closing every 2 minutes, the auction would close in 1 hour.







ND FFA Premier Chapter Finalists Growing Leaders

Etiquette Meal Killdeer

The Need. Killdeer FFA wanted to help teach members about proper dining etiquette.

The Idea. The purpose of the Etiquette Meal was to teach students proper etiquette to prepare them for professional settings.

The Result. Over 35 member attended learning proper etiquette.

Colts Care Community Service Day Richland 44

The Need. Richland 44 wanted to build unity and school spirit among students while making an impact in their community.

The Idea. FFA members coordinated a Jr/Sr school community service event day, Colts Care Community Service Day, inviting other school groups including Student Council and FCCLA.

The Result. 105 students and 14 staff completed 12 projects.

Mentorship Program Scranton

The Need. Scranton FFA wanted to provide mentors to elementary students within their school.

The Idea. FFA members started a Mentorship Program where they met with their mentees for 30 minutes learning about different aspects about being a better student.

The Result. 36 elementary students were mentored by 32 FFA members.

Yesterday Farmers Partnership Scranton

The Need. Scranton FFA members wanted to help with a local community garden.

The Idea. Their activity, Yesterday Farmers Partnership, sprouted a relationship between the community, FFA chapter, and local elementary students.

The Result. 27% of FFA members and 18 elementary students participated.

Boards for Boredom Richland 44

The Need. Richland 44 members wanted to gift a handmade game to children at the Sanford Children's Hospital.

The Idea. Members brought their Boards for Boredom activity alive by building handmade checkerboards and collaborating with their schools FCCLA chapter to make pouches for the game pieces.

The Result. 19 FFA members visited the children's hospital donating 19 games.

Three Cheers for Three Bean Coffee Wahpeton

The Need. Wahpeton FFA members wanted to encourage community members to support their local coffee shop.

The Idea. FFA members created a FFA themed drink to be sold during National FFA Week. Their project, Three Cheers for Three Bean Coffee, encouraged people to support local while increasing FFA awareness.

The Result. 125 limited edition FFA drinks were sold during National FFA Week.

Wald Dairy Trip with Elementary Napoleon

The Need. Napoleon FFA members wanted to teach and show elementary students where food products come from.

The Idea. The purpose of the Wald Dairy Trip was to expose students to where dairy products come from, learn about dairy cattle, the milking process, and the work it takes to have a dairy farm.

The Result. Napolean FFA Officers took the 3rd Grade class on a trip to Wald Dairy.

Harvest for Life Richland 44

The Need. Richland 44 members wanted to earn money to host future service projects.

The Idea. Their activity, Harvest for Life, allowed members to make a connection with area producers while also raising money for the chapter to be used for future service projects.

The Result. 14 producers donated soybean which raised \$8,213.08.

Glow Golf Scranton

The Need. Scranton FFA members needed money to send students to National FFA Convention.

The Idea. Working with FFA Alumni and supporters, Scranton FFA members created the Glow Golf fundraiser. Their event wouldn't have been possible without their program stakeholders help.

The Result. 17 teams participated in the event and members helped serve a meal.





State Star Finalists

This year seven North Dakota FFA members met the qualifications for the State Star Award. The following individuals were selected as state finalists and are recognized as Stars based on their exceptional Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE). The State Star in each area is announced Wednesday evening.

Star in Agricultural Placement Brett Baumgarten Kindred FFA

Brett's desire for farming launched his placement SAE in 2018 by working for Baumgarten Farms, his parent's grain farming operation. His SAE started as an



unpaid placement completing tasks in the shop and operating the grain cart. In 2019 his responsibilities changed by adding the operation of tillage equipment, a beet cart, and the rotobeater, furthermore becoming a paid employee.

Brett's agronomy knowledge blossomed into field scouting, the familiarity and application of crop inputs, and becoming a John Deere Operations Center expert. He has become the technology employee go to for monitor setup for all mapping and data entry from planting through harvest. He utilizes the app on his phone and has trained his employer and coworkers.

Brett's SAE has grown to managing employees at various times during the crop production year, plus the operation and maintenance of all equipment.

In 2020, Elizabeth's SAE begin by cash renting 57 acres from her grandparents and planting hard red spring wheat. In 2021, she increased her acreage and diversified her crops by planting

barley and flax, both of which were raised and sold as certified seed. During the spring of 2022, her acres blossomed to 228 acres of certified barley and flax seed.

Elizabeth farmed alongside her father utilizing an agreement to pay him for machinery and fuel based on the NDSU crop projection budgets and utilizes some labor exchange but takes out an operating loan for other inputs. Her accomplishments are learning how to develop a crop budget, work collaboratively with others, and learning to operate large machinery.

Her SAE has expanded her knowledge of the entire certified seed production process and several crop production practices that she has learned from her agronomist.

Elizabeth is a member of the Leeds FFA Chapter. Her advisor is Mr. Travis Fritel. Elizabeth plans to attend the University of Minnesota Crookston, majoring in Agribusiness. Her parents are Vicki Dulmage and the late Douglas Dulmage.

Star Farmer Lillian Steeke Scranton FFA

Lillian's enthusiasm for animal knowledge naturally evolved in into a diversified livestock production SAE in 2017 consisting of Babydolls breeding sheep, Simmental cross beef cattle, butcher chickens, and laying hens for sale and eag production.



Lillian works alongside her parents in their sheep operation utilizing a labor exchange to cover the barn, facilities, and some feed costs. She has also raised two beef herd sires that her parents use in their beef operation as part of the labor exchange.

Lillian's management practices of her 110 laying hens have evolved to an average of 45 dozen eggs per week that she sells off the farm to a variety of people from several miles away. She has sold frozen butcher chickens in four different states. The rest of her SAE has grown to a Babydoll flock of 25 head, nine beef cattle, and 285 butcher chickens in 2022.


