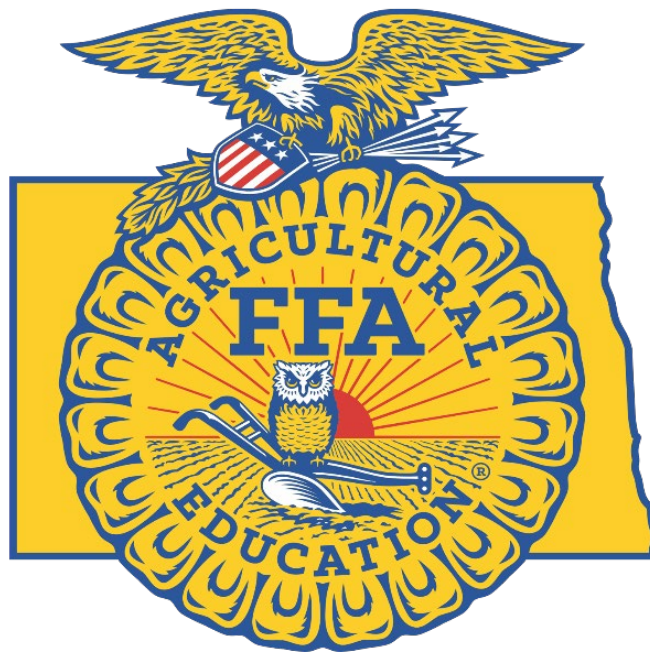

Callen has always had a thing for horses and so did our dad. I guess that is where I got it from. I loved sitting outside watching Callen train horses and ride them. But I always knew that if I was going to watch him work his magic, I had to be extremely quiet and not make any fast movements. Whoever knows me, knows that is extremely hard for me.

Just like any other ranch, many things happen during the day. In the spring when we got off the bus, and no one was in the house, our first instinct was to go check in the barn. So we dropped off our backpacks and set out for the barn. We have a little hole in the side of the barn that we could look through and see if anything that was in there. When we would go out there and look through the hole and saw dad working with a cow calf pair, there again, we knew we had to be extremely quiet and not make any fast movements.

Just because I could not talk or help with whatever was going on, I still learned just by watching and listening. By watching Callen train colts, I picked up on what he was doing and began training my own colt. By Watching my dad work with cattle, I now know how to properly care for cattle and hopefully follow in his footsteps and own my own ranch one day by learning from him and following his advice.

But just like anyone else, I am still learning. We are all still learning. We learn every single day. When we all take a step back and watch what someone else is doing, we are learning. When we accomplish something and take a step back and look over it all, we are still learning. We learn how to make improvements. We are learning how it can all change if we did that one thing differently.

I was able to learn and pickup on things that were taught to me because what we learn with pleasure, we never forget. This means when we enjoy what we are learning, it sticks with us. Like many of you, I enjoy learning about agriculture. Many of the things I have learned have stuck with me like chocolate milk doesn't come from brown cows and that when a cow is calving, the front feet come first and then the head. The beautiful thing about learning is that no one can take it away from us. We are learning from the things we read, our peers, our mentors, and ourselves. We never stop learning.

You see, when we learn something, we can teach other people. They might already know how to do that one thing but there is always more then one way to do whatever it is that you are doing. When we take a step back and look at what we accomplished, we can see that there could be a better way that it could be done. But, North Dakota FFA, the next time that something is going on or being taught, take a step back. Watch what is going to happen and what is going on. Listen to what is being said. Follow the advise. And learn.
